- I. PBA President Walter McLendon called meeting to order at 6:35 PM. Pledge of Allegiance. Welcomed all members. 30 signed the register.
- II. Treasurer Report: Mike Hartman, Treasurer, reported balance of \$11,352.15.
- III. <u>Apiary Report</u>. Roger Gauthier reported that five hives are doing well, double boxes with medium supers on. They will complete oxalic treatment and check all hives next week.

PROGRAM: Winter Hive Preparation: Bob Love. Roundtable Discussion and Q&A session for members.

Bob gave a good talk on how to best prepare hives for winter. Some of the highlights:

- Evaluate your hives for strength, brood and stores. Best to have 2 brood boxes and 1 medium super on each. Combine weak hives. If you do have single boxes, you must feed them. Lift back of hive to check weight. Should be fairly heavy now. As winter progresses, hive will become light. You must then feed.
- Winters here are not usually severe enough to insulate. It would help to put a windbreak on north side. Put reducers on entrances to small opening.
- Pest control is important. Watch for yellow jackets and wax moths. Wax moths are usually a sign of failing hive. Treat for varroa before winter. Bob explained about new oxalic treatment using sponges that Randy Oliver uses. There is a You Tube available on line that explains it.

There was good discussion and question/answer session.

Announcement made that Woodville Bee Club meets 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday at 6:00 PM Nancy Walker will conduct a honey tasting and other members will be bringing honey.
